The symbolism of returning the first fish was one of giving thanks to the Atua. Today, the act of catch and release fishing is a conservation practice, a goal of which is to prevent target species from being overfished. It encourages sustainability of the species and is a method used to manage natural resources. Te Koha Mātahi as a scholarship celebrates excellence in the primary sector in Marlborough.

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## TE KOHA MĀTAHI POLICY

Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau is investing in its members to ensure an iwi with the necessary skills and capabilities to lead our iwi and care for our resources. This scholarship is designed to increase the level of engagement and interaction with Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust and the primary sector across the Wairau/Marlborough region.

1. The scholarship shall be known as the TE KOHA MĀTAHI Scholarship.
2. The scholarship is to support a student who is undertaking full-time or part-time tertiary study.
3. Part-time study shall be considered on a pro-rata basis provided the applicant is in their final year of study.
4. Preference may be given to applicants who are within one year of completing their studies for the programme concerned.
5. The scholarship shall be awarded to advance the study of the natural environment, archaeology and social history of the Wairau region, including the management of land- and sea-based assets as they pertain to Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust. Areas of study shall include (a) Fisheries; (b) Resource Management; or (c) Environmental Sciences.
6. The value of the scholarship shall vary according to the level of study:
  - (a) 1<sup>st</sup> year - \$1,000
  - (b) 2<sup>nd</sup> year - \$2,000
  - (c) 3<sup>rd</sup> year - \$3,000
  - (d) 4<sup>th</sup> year - \$4,000
7. If the student is undertaking postgraduate or doctoral studies then the value of the scholarship shall be adjusted accordingly at the discretion of Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust.
8. In addition, the recipient shall be offered the opportunity of an internship with Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust. The internship shall include mentoring; guided work placement; opportunities for cultural involvement; and opportunities to strengthen cultural knowledge and ties to Rangitāne o Wairau.
9. Only one scholarship shall be available at any one time and shall not reopen until the holder completes their studies.
10. An individual shall be eligible to be awarded the scholarship once only.
11. The scholarship shall be awarded to a registered member of Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust attending either a New Zealand tertiary institution, or an internationally recognised overseas tertiary institution (see list of accredited universities by the International Association of Universities <http://whed.net/home.php>).
12. Selection shall be based upon leadership potential, academic merit and the potential of the applicant's research project to add the most value to the body of knowledge in the above disciplines in the Wairau/Marlborough region.
13. It is hoped that the recipient will ultimately seek employment in the Wairau/Marlborough and pass on the benefits of their learning to registered members of Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust.
14. The recipient is required to meet with Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust management to discuss progress each year and attend Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust AGM.
15. The scholarship may be concurrently held with any other award or grant provided
  - (a) the terms of that award or grant permit; and
  - (b) Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust is informed and approves.
16. The recipient shall provide mid-year and end of year academic progress reports to Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust.
17. Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust maintains the right to terminate or suspend the scholarship if the recipient has violated their tertiary institution's code of conduct (or equivalent thereof) or has failed to comply with any of the terms and conditions on which the scholarship was awarded.
18. Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust is not obliged to make an award in any year there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
19. The recipient shall have access to the resources of Te Rūnanga o Rangitāne o Wairau Trust for the duration of their studies. This may include access to information and/or collections.
20. A copy of the recipient's research projects (and any related material collection made available via the research) shall be made available to be part of the collection of Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust and potentially for use in displays or exhibitions managed by Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau Trust.
21. In the first instance, the recipient needs to forward details of their research proposal, supervisor support and a CV (including academic history and a copy of their official academic record).

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
