WĀNANGA AHUREA TĀMAKI-MAKAU-RAU

Our second regional Wānanga Ahurea was held at Bethell's Beach, Tāmaki-makau-rau, last weekend.

Up to 40 whānau attended the weekend noho, some travelling from as far as Tauranga. Whakawhanaungatanga was the main kaupapa of the weekend with various presentations about Rangitāne history, whakapapa, tūpuna and the commercial arm of the tribe.

One of the highlights of the weekend was when whānau were split into groups to discuss how they could strengthen their Rangitānetanga, and how the Rūnanga could support their aspirations. The common themes of their presentations was their desire to create a Taura Here for members living in Tāmaki-makau-rau where they can

get together more and re-connect to the Wairau. They hope for a ropū to travel to Te Kura Reo o Rangitāne o Wairau in January 2021.

The whānau who attended were extremely grateful for the opportunity to connect together and learn more about their Rangitāne heritage.

Our next Wānanga Ahurea will be held from Friday to Sunday, 16-18 October. We will be travelling by bus from Wairau to Ōtautahi to visit our taonga from Te Pokohiwi-o-Kupe and Wairau at the Canterbury Museum. To register for this event please email events@ rangitane.org.nz. THE LIVING FEATHERS ADORNING OUR PEOPLE SO THAT THEY MAY FLY

Are you or someone in your whānau experiencing hardship as a result of COVID-19 and require one-off financial support?

In June, Kurahaupō iwi of Te Tauihu launched an oranga fund to support whānau in need.

Te Kura Ora is open to all whānau who whakapapa to Kurahaupō Te Tauihu (Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō and/or Ngāti Kuia and/or Rangitāne o Wairau). It recognises our shared whakapapa and shared desire to ensure none of our people are left behind and marks a new era of collaboration.

The fund will focus on assistance with:

- Housing (rent and/or possibly mortgage repayments or rates);
- · Heating (including firewood) and other utilities;
- Kai (food vouchers);
- Oranga/health issue worsened by the advent of COVID-19;
- Other needs within the sole discretion of the Te Kura Ora Committee.

It is important to note that this fund is intended for whānau whom either cannot access or have been denied assistance from other agencies. Grants will be made on a per household basis and one grant per household will be considered in each 12-month period. The first 12-month period commences June 2020.

Applications must be made on the prescribed form and submitted to the administrator of Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau by email at admin@rangitane.org.nz or you can post it to: Te Rūnanga a Rangitāne o Wairau, PO Box 883, Blenheim 7240.

"Red feathers are treasured among Māori, a taonga of adornment and symbolic of growth. In this context, the feathers are living, the poetical use of the word Kura, being short for Kurahaupō, symbolising the three iwi being the moving vessel that cares for the kaupapa, the welfare fund. Te Kura Ora is focused on adorning our people so that they can continue to move and develop, lifting their health and wellbeing, still being able to fly."

AGM 2020 1PM | SATURDAY | 10 OCTOBER | ŪKAIPŌ

This year's AGM will be held at Ūkaipō on Saturday, 10 October 2020.

Mihi whakatau will take place at Ūkaipō at 5.30pm on Friday 9 October, followed by dinner. We encourage ahi kaa to come along and help manaaki our whānau who have travelled home for the hui.

On Saturday, lunch will be served at 11am and the AGM hui will commence at 1pm. After the hui, afternoon tea will be served followed by poroporoaki to farewell whānau who have travelled to attend.

Travel assistance is offered to all registered iwi members over 18 years of age travelling from outside the rohe. Iwi members travelling from Te Ika-a-Māui can either arrange their own travel and claim reimbursement or register by 6 September for the pre-arranged travel leaving from Levin (18+ iwi members will take priority). If you are travelling within Te Waipounamu may also claim a reimbursement. Reimbursement claim forms will be available at the AGM (please bring your bank account details as reimbursements are not paid out on the day). These arrangements are subject to COVID-19 restrictions and lockdown. At Alert Level 3 all travel and accommodation will be cancelled. We will have regular updates on our Facebook page leading up to the event.

Growing kai is a way of practicing kaitiakitanga on our whenua and can have a positive impact on the health of our whānau and the environment.

The Tuamātene Maara Kai is whānau driven, with the support of the rūnanga, and has been set up to help whānau to become more resilient and self reliant. Maara Kai enhance the mana and wairua of our whānau and ensures healthy food choices are affordable, available and accessible.

We'd love whānau to come along to our next planting day on Saturday, 12 September from 10am until 2pm. The gardens are prepared and ready and we'll have a range of vegetables to plant. To encourage whānau to come along and be part of our maara kai community we'll be giving away ten grafted tomato plants to the first ten whānau who turn up on the day.

Following the Maramataka (Māori lunar calendar) this is going to be a great day for planting kai.

MANA AHUREA | OUR CULTURE TE PUNI REO

Last month saw the launch of our te reo Māori in the home initiative, Whakahokia te Reo ki te Kāinga (Return the Language to the Home). We currently have five whānau participating in this kaupapa.

Our whānau, all based in Wairau, receive 1-on-1 weekly sessions with a specialised kaiako who supports them to use te reo Māori within their homes and everyday lives. As well as the weekly sessions in the home, all five whānau come together once a month to interact and engage in social activities using te reo Māori.

This project aims to normalise the everyday usage of the language within these five homes in Wairau and we hope to grow this initiative to more homes in the near future.

This project is funded by Te Mātāwai.


MANA TAHUA | COMMERCIAL OPERATION

Rangitane Holdings and Rangitane Investments have continued to deliver solid results for the group in recent months.

Since our last update, we have completed the ACE Tender Round for the 1 April fishing year. Whilst the revenue received was lower than last year (primarily due to a reduction in the crayfish/rock lobster value), we were pleased that the actual results exceeded our budgeted expectations.

Our property portfolio continues to deliver robust returns. Rangitāne House, which is now 100% occupied, is generating strong cash flow to support Group operations. Our Crown leaseback properties are performing as anticipated.

Our Managed Fund and Listed Sharemarket investments have recovered strongly since falling sharply in value as global sharemarkets tumbled on the back of fears due to the global COVID-19 pandemic.



We continue to explore investment opportunities and are well placed to take these up, with in excess of \$4m on deposit pending investment decisions.
